### **Come and See**

**John 1:35-42** <sup>35</sup>The next day John was there again with two of his disciples. <sup>36</sup>When he saw Jesus walking by, he said, "Look, the Lamb of God!" <sup>37</sup>And when the two disciples heard him say this, they followed Jesus. <sup>38</sup>Jesus turned and saw them following. "What do you want?" He asked. They said to Him, "Rabbi" (which means Teacher), "where are You staying?" <sup>39</sup>"Come and see," He replied. So they went and saw where He was staying, and spent that day with Him. It was about the tenth hour. <sup>40</sup>Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, was one of the two who heard John's testimony and followed Jesus. <sup>41</sup>He first found his brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated as Christ). <sup>42</sup>Andrew brought him to Jesus, who looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You will be called Cephas" (which is translated as Peter). (BSB)

- F. Jesus **changed** Simon's name to Cephas which is the same name as Peter. V. 42
