John 2:12-25 After this, He went down to Capernaum with His mother and brothers and His disciples, and they stayed there a few days. ¹³When the Jewish Passover was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. ¹⁴In the temple courts He found men selling cattle, sheep, and doves, and money changers seated at their tables. ¹⁵So He made a whip out of cords and drove all from the temple courts, both sheep and cattle. He poured out the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. ¹⁶To those selling doves He said, "Get these out of here! How dare you turn My Father's house into a marketplace!" ¹⁷His disciples remembered that it is written: "Zeal for Your house will consume Me." ¹⁸On account of this, the Jews demanded, "What sign can You show us to prove Your authority to do these things?" ¹⁹Jesus answered, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up again." ²⁰"This temple took forty-six years to build," the Jews replied, "and You are going to raise it up in three days?" ²¹But Jesus was speaking about the temple of His body. ²²After He was raised from the dead, His disciples remembered that He had said this. Then they believed the Scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken. ²³While He was in Jerusalem at the Passover Feast, many people saw the signs He was doing and believed in His name. ²⁴But Jesus did not entrust Himself to them, for He knew all men. ²⁵He did not need any testimony about man, for He knew what was in a man. (BSB)

- **I.** Here are the details of this passage.
 - A. This occurred after the wedding in Cana. V. 12
 - **B.** Jesus and His disciples went to Jerusalem for *Passover*. V. 13
 - **C.** In the Court of the *Gentiles*, Jesus found men selling items for the people's sacrifices and tithes. V. 14
 - **D.** Jesus made a whip out of cords and $\underline{\textit{drove}}$ the animals out of the temple courts. V. 15
 - **E.** Jesus also <u>poured</u> out the coins and overturned the tables of the money changers. V. 15
 - **F.** Jesus told those selling doves that they are turning His Father's <u>house</u> into a marketplace. V. 16
 - **G.** Jesus's disciples equated this event as *fulfillment* of prophecy from Psalm 69:9. V. 17
 - H. The Jews demanded a sign to prove that Jesus had the *authority* to do this. V. 18
 - I. The sign that Jesus said would prove this was His <u>resurrection</u> from the dead. V. 19
 - **J.** The Jews were unable to make a spiritual interpretation of what Jesus prophesied and kept it to their <u>human</u> understanding. V. 20-21

- **K.** The disciples <u>recalled</u> this prophecy after He had risen from the dead after three days and three nights and it helped them to strengthen their belief. V. 22
- L. Jesus *performed* many signs and many people believed in Him. V. 23
- **M.** However, His time had not yet come so He didn't allow it to become <u>common</u> knowledge. V. 24-25
- II. What can we learn from this passage?
 - **A.** This is another story meant to strengthen our *faith* in Jesus Christ.
 - **B.** God gets angry when those who know better put up <u>roadblocks</u> for others to keep them from coming to know Him.
 - **C.** We need the *mind of Christ* to understand events in our life from His perspective.
 - **D.** The miraculous sign of Jesus being raised after three days and three nights is still a *powerful* sign meant to strengthen our faith.
 - **E.** It is so important that we trust in God for His *timing* and not try to rush things.
