The Living Manna

John 6:41-58 ⁴¹At this, the Jews began to grumble about Jesus because He had said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven." ⁴²They were asking, "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How then can He say, 'I have come down from heaven?'" ⁴³"Stop grumbling among yourselves," Jesus replied. ⁴⁴"No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him, and I will raise him up at the last day. ⁴⁵It is written in the Prophets: 'And they will all be taught by God.' Everyone who has heard the Father and learned from Him comes to Me— 46 not that anyone has seen the Father except the One who is from God; only He has seen the Father. ⁴⁷Truly, truly, I tell you, he who believes has eternal life. ⁴⁸I am the bread of life. ⁴⁹Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness, yet they died. ⁵⁰This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that anyone may eat of it and not die. ⁵¹I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. And this bread, which I will give for the life of the world, is My flesh." ⁵²At this, the Jews began to argue among themselves, "How can this man give us His flesh to eat?" ⁵³So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh and drink the blood of the Son of Man, you have no life in you. ⁵⁴Whoever eats My flesh and drinks My blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day. ⁵⁵For My flesh is real food, and My blood is real drink. ⁵⁶Whoever eats My flesh and drinks My blood remains in Me, and I in him. ⁵⁷Just as the living Father sent Me and I live because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on Me will live because of Me. ⁵⁸This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your fathers, who ate the manna and died, the one who eats this bread will live forever." (BSB)

- **I.** Here are the details of this passage.
 - **A.** This all started at the feeding of the 5,000 near the *Passover* festival.
 - **B.** Jesus then relates Himself to being the <u>manna</u> that God has given His people to eat. V.41
 - C. The Jews knew of his earthly family and *questioned* His claims. V.42
 - **D.** Jesus responded to their grumblings by stating that there is a *parallel* to ones relationship with God and their relationship to Him. V.44-45
 - E. Jesus places Himself *equal* to God. V.45-46
 - **F.** Therefore, *believing* in Him is how we can attain eternal life. V. 47-51
 - **G.** They were offended at the *claims* that Jesus was making about Himself. V.52
 - **H.** Jesus proclaimed that we must eat of His flesh and drink of His blood to get <u>assurance</u> of eternal life. V. 53-58
- II. What are some interpretations of eating the flesh and drinking the blood of Jesus Christ?
 - A. Many Christians have interpreted this as participating in *Holy Communion*.
 - **B.** Those in this text interpreted it as *cannibalism*.
 - **C.** Here at NMMC we interpret this as a deep <u>dependence</u> upon Jesus for our spiritual life. This includes worship, spiritual fellowship with Him and with other believers, and our acts of service toward His Kingdom.
