<u>God's Timing</u>

John 7:1-13 ¹After this, Jesus traveled throughout Galilee. He did not want to travel in Judea, because the Jews there were trying to kill Him. ²However, the Jewish Feast of Tabernacles was near. ³So Jesus' brothers said to Him, "Leave here and go to Judea, so that Your disciples there may see the works You are doing. ⁴For no one who wants to be known publicly acts in secret. Since You are doing these things, show Yourself to the world." ⁵For even His own brothers did not believe in Him. ⁶Therefore Jesus told them, "Although your time is always at hand, My time has not yet come. ⁷The world cannot hate you, but it hates Me, because I testify that its works are evil. ⁸Go up to the feast on your own. I am not going up to this feast, because My time has not yet come." ⁹Having said this, Jesus remained in Galilee. ¹⁰But after His brothers had gone up to the feast, He also went—not publicly, but in secret. ¹¹So the Jews were looking for Him at the feast and asking, "Where is He?" ¹²Many in the crowds were whispering about Him. Some said, "He is a good man." But others replied, "No, He deceives the people." ¹³Yet no one would speak publicly about Him for fear of the Jews. (BSB)

- I. Here are the details of this passage.
 - A. The large crowd that had once wanted to make Jesus king by force was now a mob that wanted to <u>kill</u> Him. V.1
 - B. The Jewish Feast of *Tabernacles* was coming up. V.2
 - C. The brothers of Jesus *urged* Him to go to the feast to do miracles. V.3-4
 - **D.** His brothers did not <u>believe</u> in Him. V.5
 - E. Jesus told them that it was not His *time* to become public. V.6-8
 - F. Jesus waited and went to the feast in *secret*. V.9-10
 - G. People had opinions about Jesus but many kept silent out of *fear*. V.11-13
- **II.** How can we apply this story to our lives.
 - A. Many who hate God now once *followed* Him. Guard your *faith*!
 - B. Be careful who you are <u>listening</u> to. Many are motivated by selfishness and not by the Holy Spirit.
 - **C.** Being <u>*related*</u> to godly people does not make you a godly person.
 - D. God's timing makes all the difference.
 - **E.** Fear of the <u>mob</u> will keep us from standing up for God.
