Seeing a Victory

I Corinthians 2:1-5 ¹When I came to you, brothers, I did not come with eloquence or wisdom as I proclaimed to you the testimony about God. ²For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified. ³I came to you in weakness and fear, and with much trembling. ⁴My message and my preaching were not with persuasive words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, ⁵so that your faith would not rest on men's wisdom, but on God's power. (NIV)

- **I.** What are the details of this passage?
 - **A.** Paul was not known as a great public <u>speaker</u>. V.1 **II Corinthians 10:10** For some say, "His letters are weighty and forceful, but in person he is unimpressive and his speaking amounts to nothing." NIV
 - **B.** His simple message centered around <u>Jesus</u> and what He had done in and through Paul. V. 2
 - C. The power of the Holy Spirit was the main weapon that Paul had. V. 4
 - **D.** This kept the emphasis on <u>God</u> and not on the messenger's wisdom. V.5
- II. How do we apply this to our lives and to our church?
 - **A.** Begin to formulate your **story**.
 - **B.** If you have no story you probably **do not** have the Holy Spirit.
 - **C.** Only the Holy Spirit can bring real *change* to our lives and to our church.
 - **D.** Only God should be getting the *glory*.
