Proverbs 18:7-15 ⁷A fool's mouth is his ruin, and his lips are a snare to his soul. ⁸The words of a gossip are like choice morsels that go down into the inmost being. ⁹Whoever is slothful in his work is brother to him who destroys. ¹⁰The name of the LORD is a strong tower; the righteous run to it and are safe. ¹¹A rich man's wealth is his fortified city; it is like a high wall in his imagination. ¹²Before his downfall a man's heart is proud, but humility comes before honor. ¹³He who answers a matter before he hears it— this is folly and disgrace to him. ¹⁴The spirit of a man can endure his sickness, but who can survive a broken spirit? ¹⁵The heart of the discerning acquires knowledge, and the ear of the wise seeks it out. (BSB)

 - **A.** We should do **<u>soul</u>** inventories. A healthy soul produces healthy actions.
 - **B.** We should take steps to become hard workers who serve God through **everything** that we do.
 - **C.** It is important to have your faith based in <u>sound</u> theology.
 - **D.** Our <u>hope</u> must be in God, not our wealth.
 - **E.** We must <u>improve</u> our listening skills. **James 1:19** My beloved brothers, understand this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to anger. (BSB)
 - **F.** We need more <u>intentional</u> encouragers.
 - **G.** Believers must develop *godly* discernment.
