Ears To Hear

Proverbs 29:1-10 ¹A man who remains stiff-necked after much reproof will suddenly be shattered beyond recovery. ²When the righteous flourish, the people rejoice, but when the wicked rule, the people groan. ³A man who loves wisdom brings joy to his father, but a companion of prostitutes squanders his wealth. ⁴By justice a king brings stability to the land, but a man who exacts tribute demolishes it. ⁵A man who flatters his neighbor spreads a net for his feet. ⁶An evil man is caught by his own sin, but a righteous one sings and rejoices. ⁷The righteous consider the cause of the poor, but the wicked have no regard for such concerns. ⁸Mockers inflame a city, but the wise turn away anger. ⁹If a wise man goes to court with a fool, there will be raving and laughing with no resolution. ¹⁰Men of bloodshed hate a blameless man, but the upright care for his life. What did Jesus mean when He said, "He who has ears let him hear"?

- **I.** Here are the details of this passage.
 - **A.** An *unrepentant* heart leads to self-destruction. V. 1
 - **B.** The character of *leadership* matters. V. 2
 - C. A man who obeys what he knows to be true <u>honors</u> his father. A person of bad character becomes a <u>burden</u> to his father. V. 3
 - **D.** A ruler brings <u>stability</u> to the land that they oversee. Unfair taxation destroys a nation. V. 4
 - E. Beware of *flattery*. It usually hides a hidden agenda. V. 7
 - **F.** The righteous will use their <u>voice</u> to encourage and to build up others with no agenda. V. 6
 - **G.** The righteous will seek to <u>help</u> the disenfranchised. V. 7
 - **H.** You can see someone's *heart* by the results of their actions. V. 8, 10
 - **I.** Avoid financial transactions with the <u>foolish</u>. It rarely turns out well. V. 9
- **II.** What can we learn from this?
 - **A.** Do self-checks on your heart. Your mind, emotions and will need to be in *alignment* with what you know God has told you.
 - **B.** Select leaders by their character and not just their <u>skills</u>.
 - **C.** Live our lives in such a way as to bring **glory** to God by honoring those in authority over us.
 - **D.** Hold our leaders accountable for <u>unfair</u> taxation practices. It should be to pay the bills and not for redistribution of wealth.
 - E. Listen to how you talk to others. Make your words edifying and encouraging.
 - **F.** Help lift others up through your *generosity*. Ask God to help you to discover ways to do this.
 - **G.** Do <u>research</u> before committing to financial commitments with others. Their track record needs to be considered.
