## The Intro of Romans

Romans 1:1-17 <sup>1</sup>Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle, and set apart for the gospel of God— 2the gospel He promised beforehand through His prophets in the Holy Scriptures, <sup>3</sup>regarding His Son, who was a descendant of David according to the flesh, <sup>4</sup>and who through the Spirit of holiness was declared with power to be the Son of God by His resurrection from the dead: Jesus Christ our Lord. 5Through Him and on behalf of His name, we received grace and apostleship to call all those among the Gentiles to the obedience that comes from faith. <sup>6</sup>And you also are among those who are called to belong to Jesus Christ. <sup>7</sup>To all in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints: Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. 8First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is being proclaimed all over the world. <sup>9</sup>God, whom I serve with my spirit in preaching the gospel of His Son, is my witness how constantly I remember you <sup>10</sup>in my prayers at all times, asking that now at last by God's will I may succeed in coming to you. <sup>11</sup>For I long to see you so that I may impart to you some spiritual gift to strengthen you, <sup>12</sup>that is, that you and I may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith. <sup>13</sup>I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, how often I planned to come to you (but have been prevented from visiting until now), in order that I might have a harvest among you, just as I have had among the other Gentiles. <sup>14</sup>I am obligated both to Greeks and non-Greeks, both to the wise and the foolish. <sup>15</sup>That is why I am so eager to preach the gospel also to you who are in Rome. <sup>16</sup>I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, first to the Jew, then to the Greek. <sup>17</sup>For the gospel reveals the righteousness of God that comes by faith from start to finish, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith." (BSB)

- **I.** Who was this written by?
  - **A.** A man named Tertius <u>wrote</u> down this book.

Romans 16:22 I, Tertius, who wrote down this letter, greet you in the Lord.

- **B.** The Apostle Paul <u>told</u> Tertius what to write. V.1
- II. Who was it written to?
  - A. It was written to the "saints" in *Rome*. V. 7
  - B. These saints were mainly *gentile* believers in Christ. V.13-15
  - C. It was written to us! V. 16
- **III.** What were the main goals of this letter?
  - A. It was written to let them know that Paul was praying for them. V. 8-10

- **B.** It was to **encourage** the believers in this very wicked city. V. 11-12
- **C.** It was written to emphasize the meaning and <u>importance</u> of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. V.16-17
- **IV.** What can we learn from this passage?
  - **A.** We need to be praying for <u>one another</u>.
  - **B.** We need to be praying for Christians who are being *persecuted*.
  - **C.** Our emphasis has got to be in <u>leading</u> people to Jesus Christ through the Gospel!
  - **D.** We cannot be **ashamed** of this calling that all believers have.
