The Lost Biblical Principle

¹So then, men ought to regard us as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. ²Now it is required of stewards that they be found faithful. ³I care very little, however, if I am judged by you or by any human court. In fact, I do not even judge myself. ⁴My conscience is clear, but that does not vindicate me. It is the Lord who judges me. ⁵Therefore judge nothing before the appointed time; wait until the Lord comes. He will bring to light what is hidden in darkness and will expose the motives of men's hearts. At that time each will receive his praise from God. ⁶Brothers, I have applied these things to myself and Apollos for your benefit, so that you may learn from us not to go beyond what is written.

Then you will not take pride in one man over another. ~I Corinthians 4:1-6 (BSB)

I have been going through a verse by verse study of I Corinthians in our Sunday morning service. This has been rewarding but extremely challenging. This article is based upon the phrase "Do not go beyond what is written". When I studied in depth what scholars believed this to say I was bewildered that not many could say for sure what it meant. Most assumed that it was referring to the written word of God. When I looked at the passage itself, it seemed that this interpretation was partially true, but it didn't fit the context at all.

The context of this passage is local church disputes in which sides are being drawn between leaders and their particular followers. In this case, it was Paul verses Apollos. In verse 5 Paul states that judging between two leaders like this is to be left to God. This continues to say that when Christ comes He will reveal the hidden and will expose the motives of men's hearts. Then Paul goes on to state that he mentions this to teach them not to go beyond what is written. Then, in verse 6 he concludes that the result of learning this principle will be that we will not take the sides that they were taking. These sides tend to cause church wars and church splits.

I am going out on a limb now, through extensive study of this passage I am convinced that there is a lost principle here. The principle of not going beyond what is written means that we are not to judge another believer's motives or guess about their "hidden agenda". In other words, if you don't know it to be absolutely true we are to keep silent. Now this is why I said that not going beyond what is written is partially true when it is interpreted as Scripture because we do know that Scripture is true. We can apply Scripture to our leaders, but we cannot guess their motives. I am amazed at how many times I hear, "I know why they are doing this..." or "Their real intent is to...". I want to state that these statements violate the principle of going beyond what is written. If we don't know that something is absolutely true about another brother or sister we are forbidden from guessing. Motive judging is for God alone when it comes to our interpersonal dealings with others.

In conclusion, we as Christians must rediscover this principle and apply it in dealing with one another.

We have been singing a closing song lately called



"Move My Mountains". It is a prayer for Jesus to move the mountains, but the line that got me was "even when the mountain is me". We often think about mountains being our struggles outside of us, but we don't always think about us being the mountain. The first thing I thought of was the lies that are in our heads from our traditions, culture, or experiences. My son's first thought was when God tells us to do something and we hesitate to do it, we are the mountain God needs to push. Sometimes the mountains we face when dealing with people who disagree with us can also be a mountain that we create.

In the introduction of the book "When Christians Act Like Christians" by Jeff Rosenau, he shares his journey of how he realized he was the problem (mountain). He had been working with several school districts about their sex education curriculum for young children. The Holy Spirit was working on him through Scripture to change his approach from being combative to having Christlike dialogue with people. He asked to meet with a director of health education. "I explained that my purpose was simply to see if we could find some common ground, and learn together where we clearly disagreed." They ended up meeting for about 2 hours a month for a year. Each time giving each other time to express their thoughts and listening to each other. At the end of the year, this person went to her board of directors and they rewrote the curriculum.

This is a hard prayer to admit "the mountain is me." We need to grow and stretch ourselves and tear the mountain down with God's help and bring Him the glory.
