Unseen Vs Temporary

¹⁶Therefore we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, yet our inner self is being renewed day by day. ¹⁷For our light and momentary affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory that is far beyond comparison. ¹⁸So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen. For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal. ~2 Corinthians 4:16-18 (BSB)

We have been studying the book of 2 Corinthians on Sunday morning here at NMMC. It has been a great series with a lot to think about and process. We are currently in chapter 4. Paul speaks of the "unseen" versus the "temporary". The "unseen" is what we have to look forward to as children of God. This includes an eternity in the ultimate paradise. He uses words such as "eternal weight of glory" to describe our eternal destination. The "temporary" are our daily struggles. This includes disappointment in others, our own body failing, and all of the other heartaches that life throws at us. He uses words like "wasting away", "temporary", and "momentary affliction".

I did not have the best childhood. Things have been hard for me at times. However, I have never experienced the struggles that Paul went through. I have never had to be led around by the hand because I was blind. I have never been shipwrecked and had to spend a long time floating in the sea. I have never been beaten by rods, by a cat of nine tails whip, or been stoned and left for dead. He definitely had it worse that I have had it. However, he doesn't complain about it, instead he rejoices in what he has suffered. This is a good example for me. May I try to see my daily struggles as light and momentary. May I fix my eyes on the promises of God that it gets so much better. May I truly gaze at the eternal glory that awaits me and endure this life with this constantly on my mind.
