"Well, I am not sure about that because it is beyond my ability to comprehend. What I do know is that the pretenders are different than us. We were made in a factory and some of our parts were stitched by the hands of the pretenders but who made them, I cannot fathom. They are just different than we are."

"When pondering God I can know for sure, That I am created and flawed but that God is pure, I may never understand how He could be, I can just be satisfied that He is different than me."
