Proverbs 12

- ¹⁶A fool's anger is known at once, but a prudent man overlooks an insult.
- ¹⁷He who speaks the truth declares what is right, but a false witness speaks deceit.
- ¹⁸Speaking rashly is like a piercing sword, but the tongue of the wise brings healing.
- ¹⁹Truthful lips endure forever, but a lying tongue lasts only a moment.
- ²⁰Deceit is in the hearts of those who devise evil, but the counselors of peace have joy.
- ²²Lying lips are detestable to the LORD, but those who deal faithfully are His delight.
- ²³A shrewd man keeps his knowledge to himself, but a foolish heart proclaims its folly.
- ²⁵Anxiety weighs down the heart of a man, but a good word cheers it up.

Breakdown:

- **1.** It is unwise to carry around wounds that are easily reopened. True **forgiveness** is essential to act wisely. V. 16
- 2. It is unwise to pass along things that have not been <u>verified</u> as true. V. 17
- Our <u>words</u> have enormous power. This power must be used to bring <u>healing</u> to other people's souls. V. 18
- **4.** A commitment to truth gives us a lasting *legacy*. V. 19
- 5. Peacemaking produces joy in us. V. 20
- **6.** The test of speaking truthfully is in the <u>intent</u> of the speech. We must deal faithfully with others. V. 22
- 7. We must be <u>comfortable</u> in our relationship with God so that we do not have to feel the need to impress others with what we know. V. 23
- We must not pile on anxiety to others. Our words must be used to <u>build up</u> others.
