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King By Force

14When the people saw the sign that Jesus had performed, they began to say, "Truly this is the Prophet who is to come into the world." ¹⁵Then Jesus, realizing that they were about to come and make Him king by force, withdrew again to a mountain by Himself. ¹⁶When evening came, His disciples went down to the sea, ¹⁷got into a boat, and started across the sea to Capernaum. It was already dark, and Jesus had not yet gone out to them. ¹⁸A strong wind was blowing, and the sea grew agitated. ¹⁹When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus approaching the boat, walking on the sea—and they were terrified. ²⁰But Jesus spoke up: "It is I; do not be afraid." ²¹Then they were willing to take Him into the boat, and at once the boat reached the shore where they were heading. ~ John 6:14-21 (BSB)

At His trial Jesus is asked if He was the King of the Jews. His answer again affirmed that He had no interest in the politics of the day. In verse 36 He clearly states, "My kingdom is not of this world; if it were, My servants would fight to prevent My arrest by the Jews. But now My kingdom is not of this realm." (BSB) I don't want to be misunderstood. I am a big advocate of voting. It is our duty as citizens to vote. However, I do desire that Christians in America would take more seriously the Kingdom of God. The Kingdom that really matters. I personally will continue to pray for our political leaders. I have prayed for every president that I have ever had. However, the Kingdom of God is much more important to me.

Pastor Ken has been talking about the Holy Spirit in his sermons. Recently a missionary wrote about some times when they listened to the Spirit. The names have been changed for their protection.

The missionaries (George and Wendy) had invited another couple (Fred and Sally) over for a campfire "to roast hotdogs and make s'mores, which they've never done. As we were casually chatting around the fire, Sally asked "So are you required to go to church in your religion?" Maybe it's just a vocabulary glitch, but this question shows how far removed they feel Protestantism is from Catholicism. We are sure that she asked this from the perspective of her Catholic background, in which she was burdened by legalism. She now makes it clear that she is 'not religious.'

Wendy answered, "Well, there is not a 'requirement' but it's encouraged to go to church, so that you can...." and then she paused as she looked for the right words. She was about to say "be in the fellowship of believers" but the Holy Spirit stopped her from to using that "churchy" language, something we try to be aware of when we are talking to the lost. Wendy hadn't paused for long, just a second or two, when Fred chimed in with, "be with your people." This could essentially be THE MESSAGE translation of Hebrews 10:25! It was great, actually. There were a few more thoughts we shared about being in a place where we learn more about the Bible and can be encouraged."

Another time *Wendy* broke her toe and had travel plans to help a colleague who was having health issues get settled into a new apartment. This would mean she would be on her feet a lot. While still at the clinic, *Wendy* thought about canceling the trip. "And instantly, she felt the **Holy Spirit** whisper to her, 'Let your yes be yes.' That was her cue. So, we sent out a call to our prayer warriors, and changed no plans!"

God is good. The pain was not as bad as expected, It did not swell, but did turn blue. She had to change the way she walked to keep weight off her toe, but she was able to help her friend.

"So whether this happened because the accuser wanted to discourage her from going,

or just because we live in a fallen world and *Wendy* is a clutz, we want to make it very clear that we are thanking God, Jehovah-Rapha, the God who heals for this miracle!"

How many miracles or spiritual encounters have we missed because we didn't listen to the Spirit's voice? The Holy Spirit will speak to us, we just have to be listening.



Tis the season of remembering Christ's birth and how the shepherds and wise men bowed before him in adoration.

There is a tool to think about while praying. It is ACTS (Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, and Supplication). Why should we start our prayers with adoration. For one the sample prayer Jesus gave us starts with a type of adoration when He says "Our Father who art in heaven, Hallowed be Your name". Adoration is different than thanksgiving. Adoration is more acknowledging who He is and thanksgiving is more about appreciating what He has done.

I know when I start my prayers with acknowledging who He is, it helps me to put things in perspective. He is the creator of the universe, the Am that I Am (uncreated one), the One who sees everything and is everywhere, all powerful, the one who holds all things together, no one or no thing comes anywhere close to being as great as He is, not even the angels come close, at His name every knee will bow, . . .

It is very humbling when we honor God in this way. It is easier to see my own shortcomings and seems to put things in the right perspective.

The same is true when we worship. That is why we often say we have an "audience of One". There is a difference between singing about God and singing to God. When we worship and adore God directly, it helps to put everything in the right perspective.

In this season, let us truly Adore Him!
