## The Expectations of New

Revelation 21:1-7 ¹Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. ²I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. ³And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying: "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man, and He will dwell with them. They will be His people, and God Himself will be with them as their God. ⁴'He will wipe away every tear from their eyes,' and there will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the former things have passed away." ⁵And the One seated on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new." Then He said, "Write this down, for these words are faithful and true." ⁶And He told me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. To the thirsty I will give freely from the spring of the water of life. <sup>7</sup>The one who overcomes will inherit all things, and I will be his God, and he will be My son. (BSB)

- **I.** Here are the details of this passage.
  - **A.** The physical world as we know it now will all *change*. We will have a new physical reality. V. 1-2
  - **B.** We will have a face-to-face *relationship* with God. V. 3
  - C. The *hardships* that we face now will no longer be around. V. 4
  - **D.** We should live <u>differently</u> if we really believe that new is coming. This is the very definition of <u>hope</u>! V. 5-6
  - **E.** We must <u>apply</u> our hope to this life. This is what gives us the strength to overcome. V. 7
- II. How can we apply these truths to this new year and to the rest of our life?
  - **A.** We still must be good stewards to the <u>earth</u>. Just because it will someday be replaced does not mean that we can neglect to be good stewards of what God has entrusted us with.
  - **B.** We can live <u>now</u> as if the new reality has begun in our relationship with God. He desires that we walk <u>daily</u> with Him.
  - **C.** We can allow God to <u>heal</u> us of all our sorrows. He doesn't intend for them to dominate our life now.
  - **D.** We must allow our hope to change the way we <u>see</u> everything now.
